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### 3. Description of Problem, Suggested Intervention and List of Items

list of required items covered by the donation; prospected sustainable use of the donation*

**The Situation:** Scattered Bedouin communities and remote Palestinian villages from Taybeh to Jericho face significant barriers to healthcare access. These isolated areas lack sufficient medical facilities, resulting in delayed diagnoses and untreated health issues. A mobile clinic configured as a medical tent with necessary equipment connected to an ambulance car can bridge this gap by providing consistent medical services directly to these communities, improving overall health outcomes.

**Suggested Intervention:** A mobile clinic will travel through these areas, offering routine check-ups, maternal and child health services. If need be, the solo ambulance car will be used for the treatment of emergency cases. This will consequently enhance healthcare accessibility, and improve the health care provided for hundreds of individuals each month, reducing preventable diseases and improving health awareness.

#### **Description of Required Items:**

##### **1. An ambulance car in a configuration that can be alternatively used Mobile Clinic Van:**

- A spacious, well-equipped car equipped with a reliable power source (generator or battery backup)
- A medical tent equipped with lights, folding furniture, compressor etc.
- Climate control for comfort and safety of patients and staff
- Storage space for medical supplies and administrative tools
- A trailer to store and move around with the mobile clinic (tent) and its equipment

##### **2. Medical Equipment:**

- **Diagnostic Tools:**
  - Stethoscopes, thermometers, and blood pressure cuffs
  - Portable ultrasound machine
  - Portable ECG (electrocardiogram) machine
- **Examination Area:**
  - Adjustable medical examination tables
  - Medical chairs for consultations
- **Emergency Equipment:**
  - Oxygen tanks and masks
  - First aid kits (bandages, gauze, antiseptic)
  - Defibrillator (AED)

##### **3. Medical Consumables:**

- Supplies (cold storage, syringes, vials)
- General medical consumables (syringes, needles, bandages, cotton)
- Personal protective equipment (PPE): gloves, masks, gowns, face shields
- Medications for common conditions (antibiotics, pain relievers, chronic disease management)

##### **4. Communication Equipment:**

- Satellite or mobile internet for telemedicine or emergency consultations

##### **5. Administrative and Storage Supplies:**

- Filing cabinets for storing patient records
- Computers/tablets for digital patient registration and data management
- Secure storage for medications and sensitive materials

##### **6. Power and Lighting:**

- Portable generator for continuous power supply
- LED lighting for examination areas, ensuring clear visibility

##### **7. Staff and Client Comfort:**

- Seating for staff (GP, nurse, pharmacist, Community Worker, Driver) and waiting area for patients
- Portable air conditioning or heating for temperature control

**Sustainable Use:** The mobile clinic will provide long-term healthcare solutions by ensuring consistent medical outreach and creating lasting health education impacts, with the potential for local health workers to continue supporting the community.

May 2025 – September 2025 – Design and assembly of the mobile clinic

September 2025 – October 2025 – Transportation of the mobile clinic to Palestine and putting the clinic to operation

## Data protection information

The following information is provided on the basis of Article 13 of the GDPR<sup>1</sup>:
