3. Description of Problem, Suggested Intervention and List of Items

Bsharri governmental hospital is located in Bsharri, North of Lebanon, at an altitude of approximately 1,500 meters above sea level, serving a large and geographically isolated mountainous population. The region is significantly distant from any medical center that provides specialized obstetric and neonatal care, making access to such services extremely challenging, particularly during winter and adverse weather conditions.

The hospital serves approximately 30,000 local residents and 1,000 refugees, with an average birth rate of around 20 deliveries per month across the caza. Despite this ongoing need, no NICU equipment is currently available at our institution. Lebanese families rely on Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) coverage with minimal copayment, while the remaining Syrian patients pay out of pocket or depend on charitable support.

As a result, pregnant women—especially those nearing delivery or with high-risk pregnancies—are forced to leave their homes and travel to urban areas weeks before childbirth. This displacement exposes mothers and newborns to medical risks due to delayed or interrupted care, as well as psychological stress and financial hardship caused by travel, accommodation costs, and separation from family support systems. In emergency situations, the long distance and difficult road conditions can pose serious and sometimes life-threatening risks to both mothers and infants.


The absence of neonatal services significantly increase the vulnerability of newborns, particularly premature or low-birth-weight infants, and place additional strain on families and healthcare system. Addressing this gap has become an urgent necessity to ensure safe deliveries, immediate neonatal care, and equitable access to essential health services for this underserved mountainous region.

Tangible results of the project:

- Ensure the accessibility of people living in Lebanon, mainly the underprivileged, to quality services at reasonable prices compared to other institutions
- Upgrade the quality of the care for prematurely born babies and critically ill neonates and increase the capacity to save lives thanks to modern equipment in the NICU
- Widen the perspective of services provided by the hospital. With the increased quality of provided services, the hospital will be able to increase its overall income, which will lead to the possibility to increase staff salaries and thus to contribute to its satisfaction.

4-Ensure adequate location of the new equipment with suitable environmental and operational conditions.




